



Inviting Applications for **Justice Mitras** in Project Saksham 4.O

Legal Services Society, Law Centre-II is inviting applications for volunteering for Project Saksham 4.O from socially conscious and motivated students to volunteer for Project Saksham 4.O, a nationwide legal literacy and legal aid initiative led by the alumni of the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi, under the aegis of the Nek Mission Foundation.

Project Saksham 4.O is conceived as part of a broader Access to Justice initiative aimed at promoting legal awareness and strengthening the ability of individuals from vulnerable and marginalized communities to understand, claim, and exercise their legal rights. The project seeks to advance grassroots legal empowerment through structured legal literacy programmes, community engagement, legal aid interventions, and socio-legal research activities.

Under this initiative, selected volunteers - designated as Justice Mitras - will assist in conducting legal awareness drives, socio-legal surveys, legal aid camps, academic discussions, and community outreach programmes designed to strengthen access to justice at the grassroots level.

The project will particularly focus on addressing the legal needs of vulnerable groups, including women, children, persons belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, persons with disabilities, industrial workers, senior citizens, and individuals from economically weaker sections who frequently encounter structural barriers in accessing legal remedies and institutional support mechanisms.

Role of Volunteers (Justice Mitras)

Selected volunteers will be expected to:

- Conduct legal literacy and awareness drives within communities
- Identify legal, social, and documentation-related issues affecting community members
- Assist in the organisation of Mega Legal Aid Camps and Satellite Legal Aid Clinics
- Participate in seminars, webinars, workshops, and academic engagements
- Contribute to socio-legal research, documentation, and policy-oriented reports
- Support outreach initiatives aimed at strengthening grassroots justice delivery

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

- Be students pursuing law or students demonstrating a genuine interest in social justice and community engagement
- Exhibit a commitment to legal awareness initiatives and public service
- Be willing to participate in training sessions, field visits, and project-related activities

Selection Process

The selection process will be conducted in a structured and merit-based manner and will include:

- Online Application Form
- Statement of Purpose (SOP)
- Interaction / Interview Round
- Code of Ethics Undertaking
- Final Selection List

Benefits and Opportunities

Selected participants will receive:

- Official Certificate of Participation
- Performance-based Letter of Recommendation (subject to merit and contribution)
- Structured internship opportunities within the Legal Wing
- Exposure visits to courts and relevant legal institutions
- Opportunities for research, drafting, and publication
- Leadership responsibilities within the project structure based on merit and commitment
- Recognition during the National Valedictory Ceremony
